Governing document

Auchengray Church Centre Trust is a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation (SCIO) and was registered by OSCR on 25 October 2012. It is a "Single Tier" SCIO, ie the Charity Trustees are the organisation's only members and comprise the organisation's Board.

Appointment of Trustees

New Trustees are appointed by invitation of the existing Trustees. The name(s) of eligible and willing individual(s) may be passed to any Board member at any time. The Board will consider such recommendation(s) at its next Board meeting.

There is no fixed term for Trusteeship. Prior to their appointment, new Trustees would have expressed an interest in the Trust and would be familiar with the Trust's values, aims and objectives as well as its day to day operations. All Trustees are required to sign a Statement of Faith. As part of their induction programme, new Trustees are required to understand their statutory responsibilities

Charitable Purposes

The Trust's charitable purposes are:

- To advance the Christian religion by establishing an independent, non-denominational Christian Church based in Auchengray Church Centre.
- To provide recreational facilities by making the facilities of the Auchengray Church Centre
 available for use by members of the public, local organisations and individuals for recreational and
 educational purposes and for community events provided the proposed activities meet the
 requirements of current legislation eg Child Protection and are not incompatible with the ethos of
 the Trust.

- We have provided facilities for local organisations, community, school, charity and family events and meetings.




- The following **policies** have been drawn up and adopted by the Trust during the past year:

From February to the end of April 2014 the group "Sundays@7" met weekly (apart from the first Sunday of the month) and consumed lots of tea, coffee and cake around some lively Bible discussions. December ~ the Hamilton Salvation Army Band led the annual Community Carol service. The church was packed out as usual and the festive refreshments were enjoyed by all.

In conjunction with 2cytrust (Clydesdale Christian Youth Trust) we hosted a training session for volunteers taking part in "Bubblegum'n'fluff", a Christmas event for Carnwath Primary School P6's. A specified donation enabled the purchase of a new keyboard and our services have been enhanced by guest musicians including Fiona Paul from Carnwath, Krys Korsak from Lanark and David Clark and family from Armadale, along with local participants.







Auchengray Church Centre Committee - Managing the Community Facilities

Participants – anyone with an interest in the restoration, use and development of the ACC premises ie the church, the hall and the grounds.

The ACC Committee met in November 2014 to discuss and plan initial property repairs, restoration and development.

The restoration of the leaded / stained glass church windows and associated stonework was recognised as being of first priority in order to preserve the integrity of the building. Estimates had been obtained and grant funding applications are currently in process.

Discussions are taking place with Clydesdale Community Initiative with regard to the installation of an Auchengray Church Centre & Community notice board and also future landscaping possibilities for Auchengray Church Centre grounds and car park.

An office has been set up within Auchengray Church Centre to provide storage for Trust records and appliance instructions, to provide equipment such as a printer/copier, laminator, guillotine etc for hall users and as a small meeting room.

During the past year the ACC has been used as follows:

Weekly by the Craft group and Caring Knitters who have welcomed new members this year

Monthly by Auchengray WRI which has also welcomed new members this year

Daily during term time by Auchengray Primary School until the end of June 2014. The school building is now being replaced and the pupils are temporarily accommodated at Carnwath.

We were sad to see them move away last summer but we are excited about the potential of the new school and look forward to them coming back to Auchengray!
